We're competing with a lot of real-world distractions. Achieving goals is predicated on patience and self-discipline, but that doesn't mean it can't be interesting.




Show how small steps lead to big dreams.


Help students set goals that are specific and measurable.


How to use this bulletin board:


- Print out each piece.
